

# REVIEW

WHAT I LIKE MOST ABOUT TXT IS THE BRIGHTNESS OF THEIR SOUND. IT'S EASY ON THE EAR AND PLEASING TO LISTEN TO OVER AND OVER. "BLUE HOUR" SONICALLY GIVES ME DISCO ELEMENTS THAT I CONNECT WITH IMMEDIATELY AND IS FAMILIAR IN THE BEST POSSIBLE WAY. I HEAR INFLUENCE OF THE 90'S IN "GHOSTING" AND THROUGHOUT THIS MINI ALBUM. IT HAS A VULNERABLE BUT INSPIRING UNDERLYING TONE. TOGETHER WITH THE CONTINUOUS PERCUSSION THAT KEEPS ME INTERESTED MAKING ME FEEL AT EASE WITH THE MUSIC AND LET'S ME KNOW WHEN TO EXPECT THE NEXT HOOK. OVERALL I LOVE THE OLD SCHOOL FUNK AND LIGHT AND AIRY FEELING THE MUSIC GIVES ME. IT'S SMOOTH BUT WITH ENOUGH BOUNCE TO KEEP THE LISTENER WANTING MORE.
